## FROM MR. WILSON

We have just about completed another school year; as I look back to assess what we have accomplished and what work still needs to be completed, I can be satisfied with our present status. What first comes to mind is our work with outlining the next steps in addressing our facility issues at Logan View. We have also been involved in many conversations and a feasibility study with Scribner-Snyder regarding the possibility of building an educational future together. These are the highlights of a very successful school year with many other positive issues right here at Logan View Public Schools.

This is a good time to share with you the work our Board of Education has been involved with these past 15 months and where the school is at presently in regard to our facilities planning. With state and federal economics being as they are, we can (at the present time) address our facility issues with a much more economical approach than in recent history. That is good news. We have been working with Facilities Cost Management Group to outline, as best we can, the financial picture for addressing our facility issues from a number of different perspectives. The cost of facility replacement is pretty close to where we were in 2006 but with a levy that would cost about half what it did at that time.

The Logan View Board of Education has looked at upgrading our elementary facilities from two different perspectives. One is to remodel and attach new construction to the present site at Hooper. Another option is to build an elementary facility at the Logan View campus attached to the north side of the building. The Board of Education has looked closely at the cost efficiency at each proposed site. The best cost efficient option appears to be attaching an elementary to the high school on the Logan View campus.

In addition to those two different options The Board of Education looked at the cost savings if we were to merge with Scribner-Snyder Public Schools. Scribner-Snyder initiated a feasibility study to look at that picture with the neighboring districts of Logan View, Dodge, and West Point. Additionally, the Logan View Board of Education initiated their own study on the cost savings if Logan View and Scribner-Snyder merged. What we all have discovered is there would be significant cost savings to both Scribner-Snyder and Logan View if we were to merge and build an educational future together. In addition to this savings, the State of Nebraska would also provide financial incentives for our districts to merge. As of this writing, Scribner-Snyder has not yet decided on

their future plans. We are still holding conversations with them on the possibilities of building an educational future together but they are also in conversations with West Point as well.

Regardless where Scribner-Snyder chooses to merge with, one of their non-negotiable items was to keep a K-6 facility in Scribner if a merger were to take place. The Logan View Board of Education has discussed many different options to keep a facility at Scribner in a merger opportunity. They need a one elementary classroom per grade level facility as Logan View will need 2 elementary classrooms per grade level. Another question might be to build an all inclusive facility at Scribner for both districts or to build a two classroom per grade level facility in the Logan View School district and keep a one classroom per grade level unit in Scribner if a merger were to take place.

In discussions with Scribner-Snyder it is apparent that even with a merger, Logan View must still address its own facility issues. In other words, Logan View could build a new elementary facility and still see a cost savings from our present level. As much as Logan View would like to see a merger with Scribner-Snyder, they will need to decide that issue, however. It is uncertain when this decision will be made. Understand, that a decision to merge with another district is a very difficult decision for a board of education to make. It is a very painful decision from any vantage point, even with a cost savings. We have shared our cost savings information with Scribner-Snyder from our own study.

The question our Board of Education is addressing now is what do we do to address our current facility issues. The present building costs are at a level that compares to years past and lower than some recent construction. The levy cost to Logan View tax payers is half what it was in 2006. How long will that last is anyone's guess. Should our Board of Education move forward now to address Logan View's facility issues while waiting for Scribner-Snyder to decide their future? Or do we wait for their decision on their direction (which may or may not include Logan View and could take a few more years) and then pursue our facility issues? Waiting could provide higher cost of facility replacement. Our Board of Education has worked very hard this year in outlining options to address our facility issues with cost and programming being at the very heart of their work.

If you have questions regarding this work in addressing our facilities, please contact any one of our Board members. They would be very happy to discuss these issues with you to get a pulse of where our community stands on these issues. This information would be helpful for them in setting the direction for our own future at Logan View Public Schools.

## ***FROM THE SCHOOL NURSE***

Reminder for Kindergarten Parents: (2009-2010) school year: Kindergarten students are required to have a certified copy of their birth certificate, a physical within six months of starting school, a vision exam, and the following immunizations: three DTP (with the last one being given after the 4<sup>th</sup> birthday), three Polio, two MMR (with the first one being given after 12 months of age), three Hepatitis "B", and one Varicella (chicken pox vaccine) or a signed statement indicating the year the child had the disease, before they can start classes in August. These required items will need to be turned in before August 10<sup>th</sup>, 2009, in order for the student to start classes on August 17<sup>th</sup>. The Kindergarten Open House on August 10<sup>th</sup> would be a good time to turn these in if you are not able to do so before.

The above items are also needed for students transferring from outside of the state of Nebraska into any grade at Logan View Public Schools for the 2009-2010 school year.

Reminder for Seventh Grade Parents (2009-2010) school year: Seventh grade students are required to have a physical within six months of starting school in August as well as meeting the immunization requirements listed for Kindergarten students. This year these items must be turned in by August 10<sup>th</sup> or the student cannot start classes on August 17<sup>th</sup>.

**GUIDANCE NEWS**

A note to parents whose students are signed up to take dual HS/College credit classes: Mrs. Kraus met with all students registered for college credit classes before school was out. Benefits of taking these classes are lower tuition costs (Metro is half tuition), personal teacher help, and more time to learn the material. The flip side also exists. The class is at a higher level of difficulty and you must receive a C+ (85%) or above to get college credit. Students should have a 20 ACT score in Math and an 18 or above in English and Reading to take college credit classes. If the student has not taken an ACT or ASSET, or does not meet the test requirements they will need teacher permission to take the class. This is for all college credit classes. This is the **student's responsibility** to talk to the teacher and get permission from the teacher(s). Students need to take care of this **BEFORE** school starts in the fall or they will NOT be taking the class.

When taking dual credit classes it is a good idea to check with the college you plan to attend to make sure the credits will count for your major. The credits will always count as electives, but if the electives are already pre-determined (like in education) there is no reason to pay for extra elective credits. If you take Spanish all four years and test out of the level (college placement test) you need in your major; you will not need to take Spanish at UNL and other colleges. You don't need or want to pay for credits unless you can use them for electives or need them for your major.

Next year's junior and senior students and parents—Mrs. Kraus is putting together a College and Career Information booklet. It is given out during the first month of school when the student comes in for their interview. Many questions about college, scholarships, and careers can be answered by examining this booklet. There will also be valuable information from the Education Quest Foundation. **Parents...please ask to see it!!!**

There will be some math and reading worked into the club schedule each day. Children will be given some reading material that matches their grade levels.

Thank-you for an enjoyable year working with your child in math or reading at LBS or Hooper Elem. Feel free to call 654-3592(home) if you have some questions about our title program. You may call the school and ask Mr. Wilson. Logan View plans on offering Title 1 to students in Kindergarten through 4<sup>th</sup> grade again next year.

All 4<sup>th</sup> graders are assessed on each of the Nebraska State reading and Math standards. The number of students performing at either the advanced, proficient, progressing, or beginning level is reported to the state. This information will be available this fall by clicking on the state of school report link at this web site—[Http://nde.state.ne.us](http://nde.state.ne.us).

All 3<sup>rd</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup>, and 7<sup>th</sup> graders are assessed on reading comprehension and math problem solving. The results are reported to the state to meet the requirements for the No Child Left Behind Law.

Title had one full time teacher, Mrs. Hiebenthal, with 36 students receiving reading help and 21 students receiving math help sometime during the year.
